- Those who attend must wear a mask from the entrance to the chair reserved for the public and put the mask upon leaving.

Hazardous household waste includes a large number of commonly used products. Although they only represent 1% of Québec's household waste they largely increase the toxicity of a landfill if placed in household garbage. Furthermore, dumping them out in the nature can have serious consequences for the environment.

Our municipal inspector will be away from August 31 to September 27. He will return on October the first. Should you need to contact him he is available throughout the month of August. Renovations to the municipal garage will begin mid- August and will bring its share of inconvenience to the village, but in order to revitalize our village and be proud of it we must accept this inconvenience for a certain period of time. We have contacted our supplier for the large waste collection and we are sorry for the inconvenience following the lack of service. The situation should be restored.

August 3rd 2020 Council meeting follow-up

- The municipality's general manager was mandated to carry out the necessary work of the culvert on Ridge road in compliance of the tender's lowest bid and the necessary work to a dangerous sidewalk on le Chemin de la Vieille Douane.

- He is mandated to carry out the municipal council's recommendations concerning the culvert of a citizen on Dundee centre.

- He is mandated to submit bids to the council regarding the request for a street light on the municipal road at Hopkins Point.

- He is mandated to undergo researches following a request to install buoys on the Salmon River at la Vieille Douane in order to enhance security and the mandate to update de municipality's web page.

- A resolution has been adopted in order to request a copy of the agreement that has been concluded between the federal government and the Akwesasne band council.

A bit of our history.

Ste-Agnès Catholic Church.

The decree of the canonical erection of the parish of Ste-Agnès was granted on September 17 1863. The year prior, a 50 by 40 wooden chapel was built in Dundee and the construction of the presbytery was in the works for the next summer. The first priest, Abbot Alphonse-Paphanuce Tassé arrived on September the 29th 1866. Over the years two churches were built between 1926 and 1945 on the corner of Ridge road and Montée Smallman. Both churches were destroyed by fire. The current church which is located in the village was inaugurated in 1948. The location of the church was determined by the economic activity linked to the railway station operating in the heart of the village. In 2010 the church was definitely closed and put up for sale.
